Year 5 Nexus Trip

Last Friday, Year 5 went on a trip to Nexus. Whilst there, we took part in a science workshop in one of their science labs. The aim of the workshop was to extract salt from rock salt. First of all, we had to grind the rock salt using a pestle and mortar. We then added the mixture to water to dissolve the salt. Once the salt was dissolved, we filtered the solution through filter paper. The final step



was to use the Bunsen burner to heat the solution. This left behind the salt! We really enjoyed this workshop and it was great to have the opportunity to use the science labs and equipment.


Eat Them To Defeat Them!


