
The Rainbow Award

Attendance

The issue of attendance can often be a controversial one in schools but one thing we can all agree on is that good attendance at school = good outcomes for children. Every lesson that is missed by a child has an impact on how well they will achieve in school and after the last few years, it has never been more important to make sure children attend well.

It is extremely important that the children do not arrive late in the morning as their learning begins at 8.40am and it can be very difficult for a child to catch up if they don't begin with everyone else. We do monitor lates very carefully and can offer support for any families who are arriving late on a regular basis.

It is also very important that children are not picked up early from school, unless under exceptional circumstances. Wherever possible, appointments should be booked outside of school hours and where this has not been possible, documentary evidence provided of the appointment. Every time a child is picked up even half an hour early, this directly impacts on their opportunity to finish their work and consolidate their learning.

Of course we understand that there will be the odd occasion when an important hospital appointment cannot be avoided, but we really appreciate your support with this in any way you can.

That just leaves me wish you a lovely weekend. Don't forget that we won't be in school on Monday due to the funeral of Queen Elizabeth the II. We look forward to seeing you on Tuesday morning,

Years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 children can attend school in their PE clothes on the day.


