Year One had some very important visitors from the RNLI this week. We learnt all about water safety as well as the different flags that are used at the beach to keep us safe.

The four rules are:

- I. Stop and think
- 2. Stay together
- 3. Float
- 4. Call 999/112









To be safe in the water you need to be able to confidently float on your back for at least 1 minute. If you are planning on going swimming this half term why don't you try it. We also learnt about the importance of being able to explain where you are to the emergency services should you ever need to call 999.



The 'What 3 Words' app is completely free and can be used to tell the emergency services your precise location, within a 3 metre square, anywhere in the world. Why not download it today!


## PE days: Week beginning Monday 31st October
