Safeguarding

Safeguarding children is obviously our number one priority here at Weeth. With this in mind, the decision has been made to close both the pedestrian and vehicle gates at the front of school each morning at 8.40am. They will not be locked but parents do need to be aware, particularly those who drive into the school car park to drop off in the morning.

Please be aware that the school is being regularly patrolled by traffic wardens who are checking that parents are not stopping anywhere on the zig zag lines. The rules of the road state, that vehicles cannot park or wait on the yellow lines. This includes stopping to let children jump out of the car. Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel Event

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It inspires pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in the neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world. It's more important now than ever to travel actively. Active travel is a great way to build physical activity into children's daily routine. It helps them arrive to school more relaxed and alert, and is great for their mental wellbeing too. This year the challenge will run from 20th-31st March 2023 and we are taking part.

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils walking, using a wheelchair, scooting or cycling to school. A school's best five days will determine their final position and schools at the top of their leaderboards will receive an exclusive Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel certificate and prizes. If you live too far away and have no option but to drive, you might like to park a bit further away from school than you usually do and then walk in. SCIENCE WEEK SUPER CHALLENGE 2023

Challenge 1: Set up an egg drop experiment. Decorate some eggs and add them to zippi bags filled with different materials like cotton wool, paper, fabric, newspaper and then drop them from the same height. Which material protects the eggs the best? Try out some of your own ideas also.

Challenge 2: Can you blow up a balloon with ALKA SELTZER? Put some water into a small plastic bottle, put an ALKA SELTZER inside and pop the balloon on top. Does it blow up? You could experiment also with vinegar. What happens if you use worm water?

Challenge 3:Invisible Ink. Mix a little lemon or lime juice with some water and write on paper. Ask an adult to put your paper in the oven does your message appear?



We are pleased to announce that Weeth CP School has organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for PTA funds.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for Weeth CP School, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our **Bag2School** collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in a black bin bag – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to http://uk.bag2school.com/ for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

You can use as many black bin bags as you wish to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well! The more you donate, the more money we get as a school.
