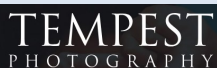
## Weeth Tigers

## Year 6: Trip to Camborne Library

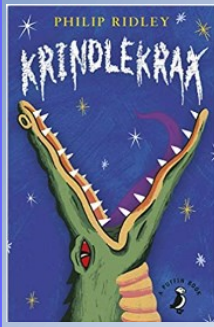
Year 6 had the most incredible trip to Camborne library this week. We learned all about the history of Cornwall and were treated to a show by the one-and-only Kernow King and his team.
