



Message from Mrs Craig

Our 'Weeth Rainbow' focus colour this half term is violet – Reflection. The final term of the year is a great opportunity to spend time reflecting on our learning, the journey we have been on and how much we have all grown. This is important for the children but also important for us as a school community - to have time to celebrate all our achievements and what has gone well but also to reflect and consider our next steps, ways to improve and develop as a school.

The parental questionnaire that we send out each year is an incredibly valuable way to gather feedback and supports us in this reflection process. We were delighted with the fantastically high number of responses we received this year and have been able to give careful consideration to the thoughts and recommendations given. We are particularly grateful for the individual comments and specific feedback that many of you felt able to provide and whilst it is not possible to provide a written response to every contribution or suggestion made, please be reassured that your voice has been heard and appreciated.

As the year draws to an end, I thought it important to share some of the common themes and opinions shared. Firstly, thank you for your overwhelming positivity about the school.

100% of the responses either agreed or strongly agreed that:

- their child feels safe
- their child is well looked after
- their child makes good progress
- communication between home and school is strong (Class Dojo)
- parents are made aware of how their child is doing and what they are learning

96% or above either agreed or strongly agreed that:

- their child is happy at school
- children are well behaved
- the school has high expectations of their child
- support for children with Special Educational Needs (SEN) is strong
- the school supports their child's wider personal development



This makes us very proud! Of course we always welcome feedback about things we could improve too and some of these individual comments included:

- re-introducing time for reading and homework for children attending Tigers
- considering ways in which children are rewarded for doing well at school
- a request to ensure that the 'R's in the Weeth Rainbow don't replace the 3 'I's (Inspire, Influence, Impact)
- expectations around homework (the homework grid) which can be time consuming and overwhelming at times

- the regularity and timing of newsletters
- opportunities to meet and discuss children with SEND
- the 10 min window for drop off and traffic congestion
- the range of after school clubs available to all year groups

I cannot pretend that we have been able to address all of these areas so far this year but we are listening and where possible making changes or adjustments as appropriate and where needed. Please be reassured that we are always looking for ways to improve and refine what we do and your support and patience is much appreciated.

It is with a heavy heart that we share the news that our teaching assistants, Mrs Harding and Mrs Tonkins will be leaving us at the end of this year. However, we are very relieved that they aren't moving too far away, but will be joining another school in the Crofty MAT, continuing to support children in the local community. After MANY years (some would say too many to mention!) but I will anyway......15 years and having supported so many children and families in that time, they will be missed greatly. But the Weeth family is a strong one and our arms stretch a long way – so we can confidently say that they will always be welcome here and we look forward to hearing all about their new adventures very soon. I know I speak on behalf of everyone when I say we wish them well and the best of luck. Not that they will need it.

Next week is set to be a busy one. Our final day is Friday 21st and we will be finishing at the normal time 2.55pm. We would like to end the year in a colourful fashion, so the children are invited to come to school in non-school uniform with a Rainbow coloured theme. Year 3 : Trip to Royal Cornwall Museum, Truro

The year 3 children had a fantastic time at the Royal Cornwall Museum on Wednesday, where they were able to take part in ancient Egyptian workshops. They went through the process of mumification and even got hands on with the steps in which Egyptians took to do this (the children all found it fascinating and, slightly funny, when Ella had to pull out the dolls brain through the nose). The staff at the museum were informative and the children learnt and got to embed a lot of ancient Egyptian facts (by Mrs Kirby).

Year 2 : Trip to Charlestown

On Tuesday Year 2 headed off exploring to Charlestown as part of our learning about 'Great Explorers of Land and Sea.' We couldn't go to the South Pole but ventured deep underneath the Charlestown shipwreck museum as part of their Shackleton experience. We started out in Shackleton's office where we noticed many differences to objects that we may find in offices today compared to in the past. There was a very strange looking phone and glasses were made from metal and not plastic. We then stepped down into the chilly caverns to explore Shackleton's cabins and the dog quarters. We even spotted Mr Chippy the ship's cat who was fast asleep in a hammock. On our way through patience camp we encountered frozen jumpers, bloomers and socks before spying a member of Shackleton's crew sheltering

from the cold inside 2 boats. Before going to the museum we already knew lots of facts about Shackleton and his expedition but we learnt new facts like they ate proper meals of sausages, peas and mashed potato while they were stuck in the ice. That's before they turned to eating penguin! We also learnt that there was a stowaway on board the ship who was sneaked onboard by several members of the crew (by Miss Tonkin).

Attendance Focus

I would like to thank all parents and carers for supporting us with school attendance this year. Through careful monitoring I have seen a real improvement in our attendance figures across the year. As you all know good attendance is seen as anything above 96%, and this is the target we aim to meet as a school. As explained in our school attendance policy we do not allow holidays in term time.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of \pounds 60 if paid within 21 days or \pounds 120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to \pounds 2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

I look forward to working with you all on this again next year and improving our school attendance data further. Mrs Peacock
