WEETH SPONSORED READ

In order to raise some money for some much-needed new books and encourage a lifelong love of reading at home and at school, we will be running a sponsored read between Monday 25th September and Friday 1st October inclusive. Please help us to enhance our reading resources for all pupils by encouraging your child to spend a small amount of time each day either reading to themselves, to others, or being read to. They can read books, comics, magazines, newspapers, menus, websites, recipes, poems, leaflets instructions – anything with words! During this time, you do not need to fill in the normal school reading record – just the reading log sheet which has been sent home today.

To support our sponsored read, please use the sponsorship form that has also been sent home with your child. We have explained to children that they should only ask friends and family to sponsor them and certainly should not be approaching strangers. They could be sponsored for each minute they read or just for reading an agreed number of times/days — it's really up to you!

After the sponsored read, please send all sponsorship money that your child has raised to the school by Wednesday 4th October. Payments can be made via the ParentPay portal or cash at the school office. We look forward to being able to use the proceeds to purchase lots more books our pupils to read, share and enjoy.


