Message from Mrs Craig

Well considering it was a short week for the children, we certainly managed to squeeze a lot in! This week sees the start of Black History Month. In recognition of the leadership, talent and impact of black women in history and today, the theme this year is - Celebrating our Sisters. During our assembly on Monday, we found out about the inspirational Rosa Parks, and how her decision not to give up her seat on the bus in December 1955 led to the Montgomery Bus Boycott by 17,000 black citizens. We thought about her bravery and the impact her decision had on the Civil Rights Movement and the struggle for racial equality. We will be continuing to learn about other inspirational black women throughout October.

After talking to the children about Democracy last week, we were able to put things into action this week and give the children the opportunity to experience it in 'real life'. We are so impressed and proud of the huge number of children who put themselves forward to become a School Councillor, many of them preparing and sharing with their class, short speeches about why they felt they should be voted for. Ms Horner did the most amazing job of setting up the hall as a Polling Station, with specially prepared Ballot Papers and voting booths for the children to cast their votes. There was even a Ballot Box for the children to post their ballot papers in before the 'big count' after lunch. One of the things that has impressed me the most, is the kind spirit in which the voting took place – encouraging and congratulating one another and overcoming disappointment admirably. Thank you to any parents who helped with preparing speeches and encouraging the children to take part.

We have been completely blown away by the incredible response to the Weeth Sponsored Read ☺. The sponsor money has been rolling in over the last few days and we have already made over £1000! Thank you so much to everyone who has supported the children with this fund raising event, it will make such a huge difference to our library, particularly at a time when school budgets are so tight. 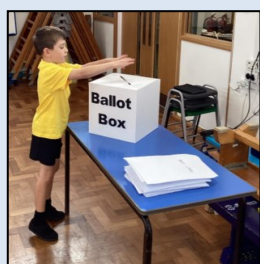
