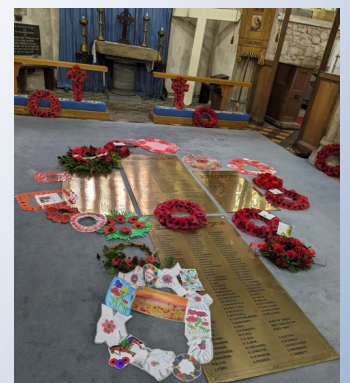

Remembrance

With it being Remembrance Day tomorrow, some of our Year 4 children accompanied Miss Hamilton to the Camborne War memorial today, to lay a commemorative wreath of poppies. This is a very special event on the school diary each year and enables the children to pay their respects and remember all those who have died in wars both past and present. Miss Hamilton said that the children were very respectful and asked lots of questions, wanting to know and understand as much as they could. The Camborne Remembrance Parade will take place on Sunday, starting at 10am. The parade leaves Commercial Square at 10.40am making it's way down Trelowarren Street onto Union Street, across Cross Street, down Commercial Street before arriving at St Martin and St Meriadoc Parish Church for the laying of wreaths. I know many of you will be involved in the parade if your children attend Cubs, Scouts, Brownies or Guides – but anyone is welcome to attend and pay their respects.



Christmas

I know it still feels a little early to be mentioning the word – but Christmas is fast approaching! We remain very aware that family circumstances can be very different and with this in mind, we would like to help reduce the cost and support wherever we can.

List of items that can be donated / go in shoe boxes: (Not ALL these things would go in a single shoe box)

Soap or shower gel, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, tooth brush, tooth paste, new socks, hats, scarf or snood, gloves, comb or hairbrush, baby wipes, sanitary towels, individually wrapped tea bags / coffee/ hot chocolate, sweets, chocolate, biscuits, notebook and pencil, torch and batteries, tissues, hand cream, small games, playing cards, small puzzle, puzzle book and pen, rain mac or poncho, Christmas card written to the person receiving the box.

Please note : Blankets, thermals, jumpers and coats can also be donated and these will be given to the organisations that deal directly with the homeless and vulnerable.

If you decide to create your own box, it should not be sealed, but wrapped with festive paper so that the contents can be accessed before putting a seal on it. Last date for boxes will be **15th December**.
